The Feast of St Cuthbert of Lindisfarne The Third Sunday of Lent

Sunday 23 March 2025

In keeping with the Lenten season of self-denial, preparation, and penitence, no Alleluias are sung. The penitential liturgical colour of **purple**, however, gives way to **white** and **gold** for this celebratory day.


Bible Readings are taken from the New Revised Standard Version. Please ask one of the Duty Elders if you would like a copy.
